Thursday, July 23

Indoor Track: Morning Sessions

9:00 – 9:45 am: Consumer Insights for Christmas Tree Growers: Key Findings and Implications – Kevin Chastagner and Lauren Hearit, Hope College. This session presents findings from a statewide consumer research study conducted as part of a multi-year project supported by the Michigan Christmas Tree Association. Attendees will learn how consumer values, life transitions, and household characteristics shape preferences among both real and artificial tree buyers. The session also explores implications for promotional messaging and customer targeting.

9:45 – 10:30 am: Growing Forward: The Future of the Real Christmas Tree Board – Marsha Gray, Executive Director, RCTB. With an expected positive referendum outcome and over a decade of industry support, the RCTB is focusing on its next chapter. Marsha Gray will share insights and lead a discussion on the future of real Christmas trees and the evolving role of the Board.

10:45 – 11:30 am: Chemical Mowing as an Integrated Weed Management Strategy for Michigan Christmas Tree Production – Debalina Saha, Michigan State University. Explore the efficacy of chemical mowing as an alternative to repeated herbicide use. This study evaluates potential phytotoxic effects on Canaan fir, Fraser fir, Norway spruce, and Scotch pine.
